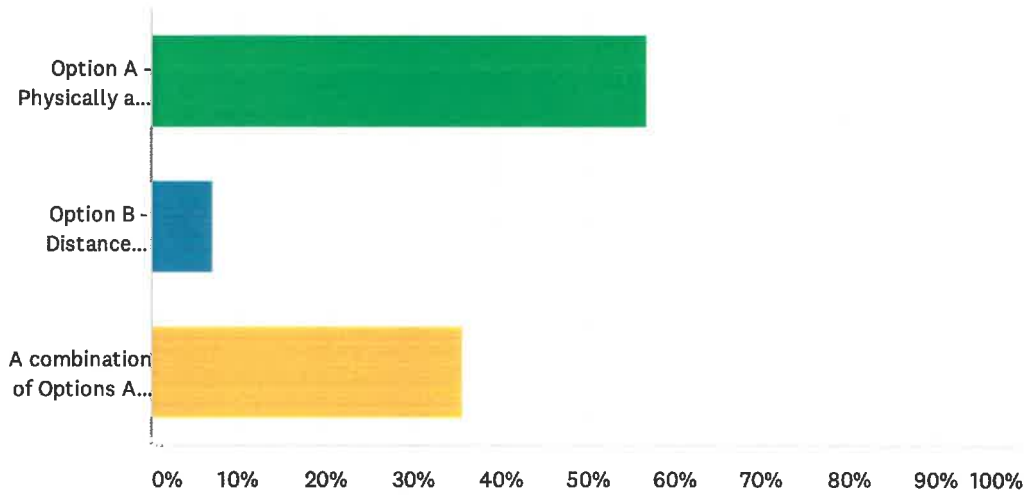


Q1 Assuming all guidelines for reopening schools have been met, how would you prefer student's to attend school in 2020-2021?

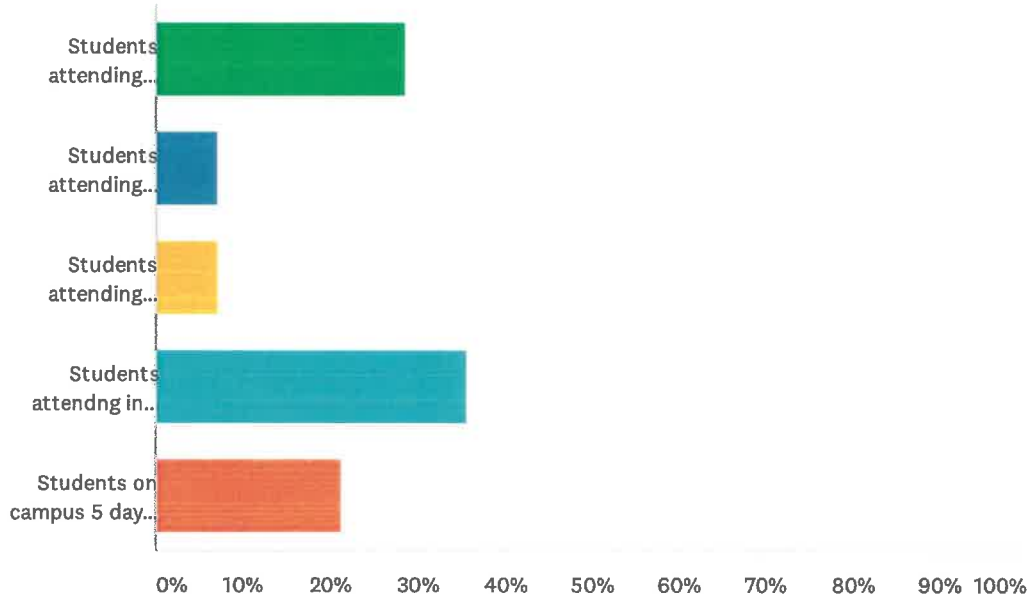

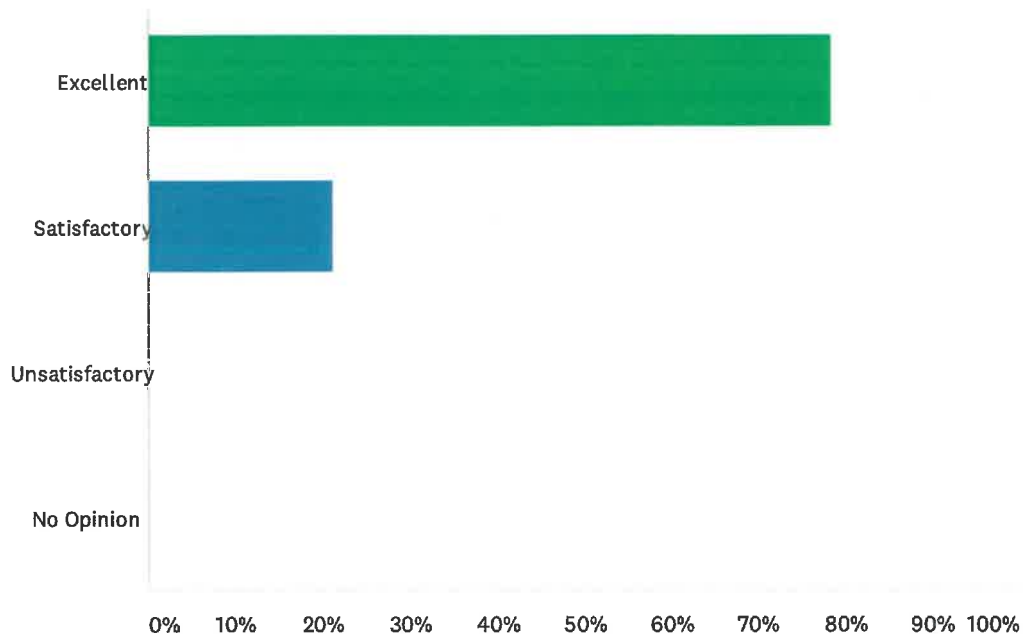

Q3 How would rate the communication from your school and the school district about school closures, distance learning, meals services, and other needs?

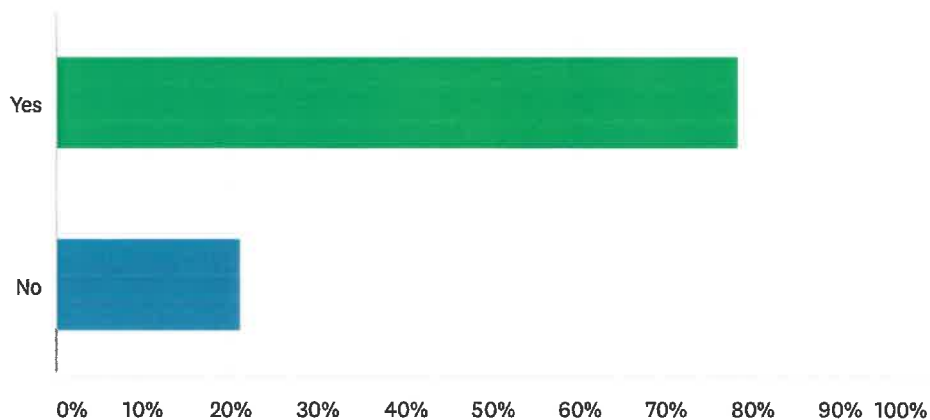
